Wellbeing in Mind Team

In this ever-increasing digital age, we would like to spread the importance of supporting your child with their online activity and being kind online. Negativity online can have a big impact on mental health and wellbeing.

Top Tips

- Lead by example. As a parent, you are a role model for your child's behaviour and attitudes. If you are kind and respectful online, and your child is exposed to examples of these types of kindnesses, then your child is more likely to follow your lead.
- Talk to your child about online kindness. Don't assume that your child knows how to be kind online –
 instead, take the time to talk to them about it. Discuss the importance of being kind and respectful
 online and give them specific examples of what this looks like in practice.
- Help your child understand the consequences of unkind online behaviour. While it can be tempting to
 brush off unkind online behaviour as "just words," it's important to help your child understand that
 their words and actions online can have real consequences. Discuss with them the potential impact of
 unkind online behaviour on other people, and the potential consequences for themselves as well (such
 as being blocked or banned from social media platforms). Additionally, comments posted online can
 have permanent consequences and can potentially be attached to your child for the rest of their life.
- Provide support and guidance as needed. If your child is struggling with unkind online behaviour, or if
 they are the target of unkind behaviour from others, it's important to provide them with support and
 guidance. Remember, the internet was not intended to be a social hub for children.
- Help your child to understand their options for responding to unkind behaviour, and to take action to
 protect themselves and others. If you, as parents, can show compassion for your child's mistakes
 (whether they are engaging in unkind behaviour or on the receiving end), then your child will learn
 and be more likely to come to you next time for help.


Overall, teaching children to be kind online involves setting a good example, having open and honest conversations, and providing support and guidance as needed. By taking these steps, you can help your child develop the skills and attitudes they need to be kind and respectful online.
