School Improvement Priorities

We have been looking ahead to the next academic year and planning exciting learning in each of the subject areas. We have thought really carefully about how we can involve parents and carers as much as possible in the work that the children do across the curriculum so there will be lots of opportunities to come into school and see the children's work. We are really looking forward to it!

Health & Safety and Safeguarding

- If children are riding their bikes to school, they should be wearing helmets. Please talk
 to your children about being safe on their bikes especially when riding across roads in
 front of traffic.
- We have noticed that some children are coming to school wearing nail extensions or fake nails. These are not allowed in school. If your child attends school wearing these they will not be able to take part in PE lessons or play outside due to health and safety risks.
- A reminder that jewellery (other than stud earrings and watches) should not be worn at school. If your children are wearing jewellery, they will be asked to remove it whilst in school. No jewellery should be worn in PE lessons and children will be asked to remove stud earrings and watches.
- We have heard from a couple of local dental surgeries in recent weeks who now have NHS spaces for children. If your child is not registered with a dentist you could contact Perfect Smile Clinic on Boroughbridge Road.
- The weather is still very poor. It is cold and wet yet we have many children who are not bringing coats to school. Please check that your child is bringing a coat with them so that they can still go outside in the rain. Thanks.

We would recommend that you focus on good sleep routines, making sure that the children are eating healthily and are spending time outside in the fresh air, all these things help with our mental health and wellbeing and ultimately the ability to focus and manage stress at important times in our lives.

Together we raised a whopping £1750 for OSCAR's Paediatric Brain Tumour Charity! Thank you so much for your generosity and supporting such a great cause.

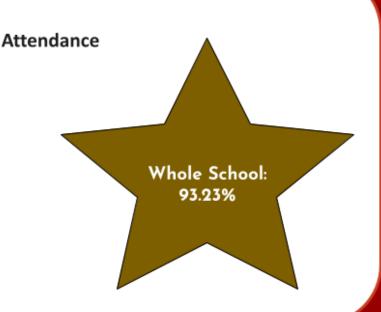
