European Expedition



As part of our whole school Big Idea – Where in the World? - Year 5 will be learning all about Europe and its rivers and landmarks. We will undertake lots of enquiry based activities to learn about the countries and cities within Europe. We will study some of the most famous natural and manmade landmarks across Europe and explore the cultural diversity displayed across the remarkable continent in which we live. We will learn about a river's journey from source to sea and explore its features. We will also consider the reasons why settlements developed alongside rivers and the importance of rivers in the past and still today.

Topic Launch

During launch day we will learn about the features of

rivers as the water travels from source to sea. We will also learn about the process of erosion and deposition in rivers.



Science

We will explore the life cycles of a number of animals from different classifications and we will learn about the process of reproduction in plants.

Through our Science lessons, we will also learn about the conservationist Marjory Stoneman Douglas, known for her staunch defence of the Everglades against efforts to drain it and reclaim the land for development.





Linked to our Learning Adventure, we will also learn about the water cycle.
